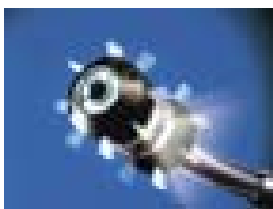

Sewers



Picture it...

You have a 4" drain line that is plugged up tight and it's backing up on your floor, sinks, toilet, or bathtub...Yuck! In comes your plumber to rod the line with a 3.5" cutter head...you get the picture right? You can bore a 3.5" hole in a 4" plugged line, but you will sooner than later have a backup again because there is residual waste left behind. Residual waste is also called "buildup". Buildup is caused by the rough and corroded surfaces inside of the old drain pipes giving waste a surface to adhere to. Once waste adheres to the inside of your drain pipe, it can accumulate until your sewer backs up.

At the Richard P. Waltz Plumbing & Heating Co. Inc. we can use an expandable cutter head to get the full 4" of buildup removed. We can then powerjet, which is the best way to clean the line because a powerjetter removes buildup and in most cases can bring the pipe back to 92% of its condition when it was new!

Getting to the root of the problem...

Have you ever seen a tree topped off that continued to grow new limbs at the base? Have you ever cut a houseplant back to encourage growth? If roots are your trouble, you already know that you have a long-term problem. Rodding promotes new root growth and roots grow year round—especially in the fall, winter and spring.

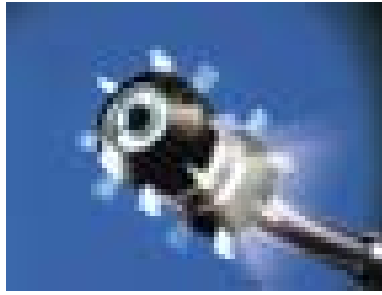
Did you know that roots grow inward toward moisture and can penetrate an extremely small opening? Roots can penetrate your sewer line and while roots begin small, they grow in size on both sides of the opening that they entered through. This process often seals the cracks the roots made in the first place. The roots continue to grow and can eventually

exert enough force to permanently damage the pipe (or at a minimum, block the pipe causing a backup).

Until recently, a homeowners only option for temporarily ridding themselves of the root trouble has been to replace the sewer line, or to rod the sewer (sometimes 3-4 times a year) until it collapses and you are forced to replace the sewer anyway!
